

Coronavirus Food Assistance Program

Updated June 22, 2020

The Coronavirus Food Assistance Program provides vital financial assistance to producers of agricultural commodities with financial assistance that gives them the ability to absorb sales losses and increased marketing costs associated with the COVID-19 pandemic.

The number of applications on this summary includes both approved applications as well as those that have been signed by producers but not yet approved. The payment figure represents only the approved applications that have forwarded for payment processing. Data will be updated and released each Monday by 2 p.m. EDT on farmers.gov/cfap.

FSA has processed \$4,006,461,973 in payments to 252,489 producers.

Non-specialty commodities include malting barley, canola, corn, upland cotton, millet, oats, soybeans, sorghum, sunflowers, durum wheat, hard red spring wheat, and wool.

Livestock includes cattle, hogs, and sheep (lambs and yearlings only).

Specialty crops include:

- **Fruits:** apples, avocados, blueberries, cantaloupe, grapefruit, kiwifruit, lemons, oranges, papaya, peaches, pears, raspberries, strawberries, tangerines, tomatoes, watermelons
- **Vegetables:** artichokes, asparagus, broccoli, cabbage, carrots, cauliflower, celery, sweet corn, cucumbers, eggplant, garlic, iceberg lettuce, romaine lettuce, dry onions, green onions, peppers, potatoes, rhubarb, spinach, squash, sweet potatoes, taro
- **Nuts:** almonds, pecans, walnuts
- **Other:** beans, mushrooms
