


When disaster strikes, we're here to help you. The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) offer a variety of recovery programs to help farmers, ranchers, communities and businesses that have been hard hit by wildfire. Learn about the USDA programs and FEMA's Hermit's Peak/Calf Canyon Claims Office that can help you recover from the Hermit's Peak/Calf Canyon Fire and subsequent flooding.

Per federal regulation, duplicate benefits are prohibited in all programs. Applicants cannot receive benefits for the same losses and restoration efforts through multiple programs.

### FARM SERVICE AGENCY (FSA) PROGRAMS

Emergency Conservation Program (ECP) – Provides emergency funding and technical assistance to farmers and ranchers to rehabilitate farmland and conservation structures damaged by natural disasters. Applicants may receive up to 100% of the cost of approved restoration activity not to exceed \$500,000 or 50% of the agricultural value of the affected land. A 25% advance payment for all practices is available.

#### **Emergency Forest Restoration Program (EFRP) -**

Provides technical and financial assistance to owners of non-industrial private forests to restore forest health and resources damaged by natural disasters. Applicants may receive up to 100% of the cost of approved restoration activity not to exceed \$500,000. Funding provided to the applicant will be taxable.

Note: Once EFRP eligibility has been verified, FSA refers the request to the New Mexico Forestry Division who will contact the landowner to schedule a visit to the property and to create a restoration plan. Once the plan is returned to FSA, the project is sent to the State and Tribal Historic Preservation Offices for a cultural resource consultation to comply with National Historic Preservation Act, which requires a minimum of 30 days. The application is then sent to the County Committee for approval.

# NATURAL RESOURCES CONSERVATION SERVICE (NRCS) PROGRAMS

### **Emergency Watershed Protection Program (EWP)** -

Recovery effort aimed at relieving imminent hazards to life and property caused by floods, fires, windstorms, and other natural disasters. Up to 100% of the cost can be provided by NRCS.

**Threats Addressed:** Debris-clogged waterways; unstable streambanks; severe erosion jeopardizing public infrastructure; wind-borne debris removal, and damaged upland sites stripped of protective vegetation by fire or drought.

# FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY (FEMA) PROGRAM

### The Hermit's Peak/Calf Canyon Claims Office -

The Hermit's Peak/Calf Canyon Fire Assistance Act provides compensation for those impacted by the Hermit's Peak/Calf Canyon Fire in San Miguel and Mora Counties. The Claims Office will compensate for reforestation based on several best practices associated with the healthy restoration of forest lands. This includes woody residue treatment (a practice that uses various methods to treat woody residue such as tree trunks, branches, limbs, twigs, and other post-fire debris to achieve reforestation objectives); brush management; tree and shrub establishment; erosion control treatments; installing tree protection; installing appropriate-sized drainage features on roads and trails; seed collection; and weed treatments. Funds provided through the Claims Office are not taxable.

**Application Period:** Notices of Loss are due by November 14, 2024.

There are three avenues to develop a claim for reforestation:

- Submit a Conservation Restoration Plan developed by the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS). Claimants who have received NRCS plans will be compensated based on the rates developed by the Claims Office. Anyone who has already been paid for their plan will receive any additional compensation to match the Claims Office's valuation methods.
- 2. Submit a privately sourced plan. The Claims Office will accept plans developed by private contractors, which may be compensated based upon the Claims Office's valuation methodology.
- 3. If a claimant prefers not to submit a plan developed by NRCS, or or by a private contractor, the Claims Office will determine a per-acre rate for reforestation based on the per-acre valuation methodology, which will vary based on the burn severity of the property, with higher rates for more severely burned properties.

Note: Through a <u>Conservation Restoration Plan</u>, NRCS helps claimants/producers, at no cost, to identify damages to their natural resources resulting from the Hermit's Peak/Calf Canyon fire and subsequent flooding. NRCS will include cost estimates for recovery actions eligible for potential compensation under the Claims Office.

# Hermit's Peak/Calf Canyon Wildfire Restoration Guide

A variety of restoration practices may be needed to restore the natural resources and return the land to its pre-disaster use.

The table below summarizes the restoration practices that may be needed and indicates which program(s) may provide assistance.

Eligibility for practices on this list compensable through the claims office and FSA will be based on the damaged caused by the fire and may include more practices than listed to recover from the damages.
